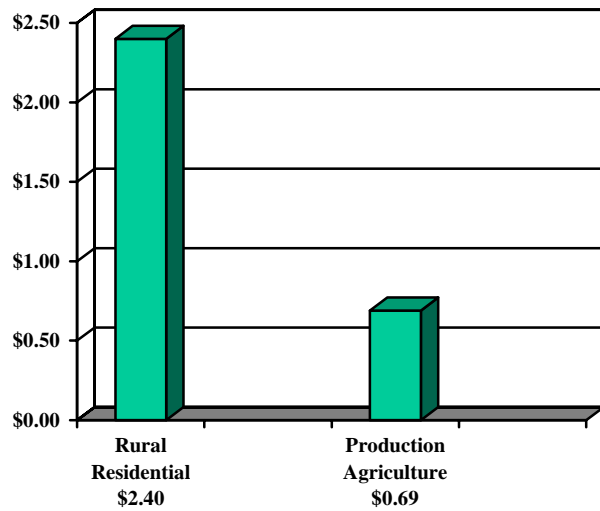

Cost of County Services Per Dollar of Revenue For Wyoming

(University of Wyoming, College of Agriculture, Department of Agricultural and Applied Economics)



The above graph indicates the cost of county services per dollar of revenue for the State of Wyoming. On one hand, Rural Residential lands demand \$2.40 in services for each dollar of local tax revenue. On the other hand, land used in Production Agriculture requires only \$0.69 of services for each dollar of local tax revenue.

Your Ag Tax Committee is made up of producers from every county in Wyoming. We are proud of the hard work we do to keep taxes levied on our industry to a minimum.

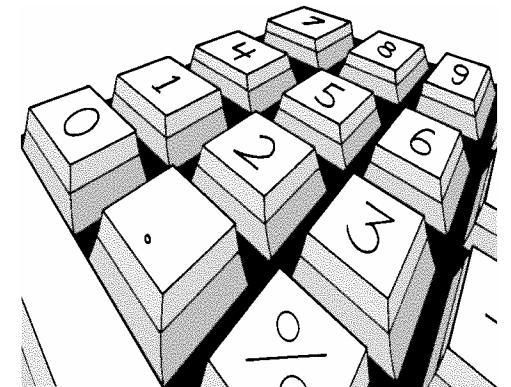
